PETITION TO THE HON'BLE PRESIDENT OF INDIA

SEEKING URGENT INTERVENTION FOR JUSTICE FOR THE SIX ABDUCTED LIANGMAI
NAGA CIVILIANS, THE KILLING OF SHRI CHUNJANGLUNG PANMEI, AND THE
PROTECTION OF INDIGENOUS NAGA COMMUNITIES IN MANIPUR

Subject: Urgent intervention sought in the ongoing violence against Naga civilians in Manipur

Your Excellency,

We, the members of the Zeliangrong Students' Union Pune (ZSUP), Maharashtra, write to you with profound grief, anguish, and a deep sense of injustice over the tragic events unfolding in Manipur.

For nearly a month, the families of six abducted Liangmai Naga civilians have lived through unbearable pain and uncertainty. These innocent men were taken away from their families, and while their loved ones continued to hope and pray for their safe return, reports have now emerged that they may have been killed and their mortal remains concealed.

For the affected families, this is not merely a security issue. It is a human tragedy of the highest order. Fathers, sons, brothers, and community members were taken away, and their families have been denied even the basic dignity of knowing their fate and performing their final rites.

As our people continue to seek answers regarding the six abducted Liangmai Naga civilians, the situation has been further aggravated by the brutal killing of Shri Chunjanglung Panmei, a respected member of the Zeliangrong Naga community from Pongringlong Village. His killing has sent shockwaves across Naga society and reinforced the growing fear that innocent civilians are increasingly becoming targets of violence.

These incidents have created a deep sense of insecurity throughout Naga-inhabited areas of Manipur. The continued abductions, killings, intimidation, and attacks on innocent civilians have shaken public confidence and raised serious questions regarding the effectiveness of existing security arrangements.

Your Excellency, the Zeliangrong people and other Naga communities have lived on these ancestral lands for generations. We are descendants of the great freedom fighters Haipou Jadonang and Rani Gaidinliu, who dedicated their lives to defending the dignity, identity, and rights of their people. We have always stood for justice, peace, and coexistence, but we cannot remain silent when innocent civilians are abducted, murdered, and denied justice.

The present crisis is no longer a mere law-and-order issue. It involves grave concerns relating to armed militancy, narco-trafficking networks, illegal cross-border activities, intimidation of indigenous communities, and repeated attacks on innocent civilians. Unless decisive action is taken, the situation will continue to deteriorate and further endanger peace and stability in the region.

In light of these circumstances, we humbly place the following demands before the Hon'ble President of India:

1. The abduction and reported killing of the six Liangmai Naga civilians must be handed over to the National Investigation Agency (NIA) or a Special Investigation Team constituted by the Government of India so that an independent and credible investigation can be conducted.
2. The Government must immediately recover the mortal remains of the six victims and ensure that they are returned to their families with dignity and honour.
3. Every individual involved in the abduction, detention, killing, concealment of evidence, and any subsequent cover-up must be identified, arrested, and prosecuted without fear or favour.
4. The killing of Shri Chunjanglung Panmei must be investigated as part of the broader pattern of violence affecting Naga civilians, and all those responsible must be brought to justice.
5. The Government of India must immediately review the Suspension of Operations (SoO) arrangements with armed groups operating in Manipur and take appropriate action wherever there are credible allegations of involvement in kidnapping, murder, extortion, narco-trafficking, or activities prejudicial to national security.
6. A high-level inquiry should be instituted into the prevailing law-and-order situation in Kangpokpi District and surrounding areas to determine whether there have been administrative failures, lapses in security, or failures of accountability.
7. Given the gravity of the situation and the growing loss of public confidence, we call upon Deputy Chief Minister Nemcha Kipgen to step down on moral grounds pending the outcome of any independent inquiry into the security failures that have occurred within her district and area of political responsibility.
8. Any allegations concerning the involvement, influence, association, or support of politically exposed persons, public officials, or their associates in unlawful activities must be investigated independently and impartially, and no individual should be placed above the law.
9. The Government of India must strengthen security deployment in vulnerable Naga-inhabited areas and ensure that no innocent civilian is subjected to abduction, murder, intimidation, or displacement.
10. The ancestral lands and traditional territories of the Zeliangrong Nagas and other indigenous communities must be protected from illegal encroachment, unauthorized occupation, and unlawful settlement in accordance with the Constitution and the laws of India.

Your Excellency, our appeal is not born out of hatred toward any community. It is born out of grief, fear, and the desperate hope that justice will prevail. The families of the six abducted men deserve answers. The family of Shri Chunjanglung Panmei deserves justice. The people of Manipur deserve peace.

We therefore place our trust in the highest constitutional office of the Republic and earnestly request your immediate intervention to ensure justice, accountability, and the protection of innocent lives.


May justice prevail and may peace be restored in Manipur.
